Hardship Scholarships for Years 10, 11 or 12 entry and are available for new and current students.

Fee remissions are available on application at the discretion of the Principal. Please provide further details in writing and evidence of financial circumstances.

A school card discount of 30% is also available to families who have been approved by the Department for Education's School Card (Non-Government Schools) office. Please contact the School Accountant for more information or apply online via the South Australian School Card Scheme.

EXPECTATION

The continuation of the scholarship is subject to the recipient making good academic progress, contributing to the life of the College, displaying conduct of a high standard and an annual review process including the Principal and Dean of Student Experience. Each recipient will be expected to provide feedback to the Principal about the impact of the scholarship. The family will be invited to participate in occasional events and activities that recognise and give thanks to the community of donors.

HOW TO APPLY

- Complete the online scholarship application form
- Upload copies of all relevant documentation
- Payment of Scholarship Application Fee \$100 (new students only)

All applications must be submitted through our online application process which can be accessed on our website within our scholarship categories. You will receive an email confirmation of application receipt. Refer to the checklist to ensure you have the correct documentation ready to submit with your application.

All new students who submit a scholarship application are required to sit a general ability test and have an enrolment interview. The Enrolment Officer will inform you of the outcome of the Scholarship you applied for when known.
